Welcome to DCR's Freetown-Fall River State Forest

The site of a Wompanoag Indian reservation and a natural rock outcrop known as Profile Rock, Freetown-Fall River offers 5,441 acres of park land primarily used for hiking and various trail use.

It is part of the Massachusetts state park system and is managed by the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), an agency of the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs. DCR oversees 450,000 acres of parks, forests, beaches, bike trails, watersheds, and dams. Its mission is to protect, promote, and enhance the state's natural, cultural, and recreational resources. - TRAIL USE GUIDELINES AT FREETOWN-FALL RIVER
- Stay on designated trails and roads.
 - Observe all posted rules and regulations.
 - Be respectful of other trail users:
 - Hikers:** Allow bicyclists and equestrians to pass.
 - Bicyclists:** Control your bike-do not skid. Avoid startling horses and hikers-announce yourself.
 - Equestrians:** Control your horse.
 - Be aware of hunting seasons, and wear blaze orange when appropriate.
 - Motorcycle Riding Season: May 1 through the last Sunday of November.
 - Yield to sled dogs.
